A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"Be like people waiting for their master to come home from a wedding celebration, who can immediately open the door for him when he arrives..."

Luke 12:36 (CEB)



Some days it seems like all we do is wait. We wait in line, wait at the doctor's office, wait on the phone, wait for a reply, etcetera, etcetera, etcetera. And it's hard. We've become used to this you-get-what-you-want-when-you-want-it world. We expect to get what we want immediately.

When we don't get what we want, what's our most common response? Impatience. Then frustration. Maybe even anger. Followed by isolation as we walk away. I think these are signs we're looking at things from the wrong end of the telescope. Rather than seeing things from a healthy, spiritual perspective, we can turn splinters into logs.

There's another way to live. It's hopeful. It gives us life. We can live as children do, joyfully awake and aware. Theologian Dallas Willard said, "You must arrange your days, so you are experiencing contentment, joy and confidence in your everyday life with God."*

When you seek God in each moment, you will find the Spirit present. This changes our lives for the better. And it touches the lives of those around us. When our soul is centered on God, we seek restorative justice for all.

The catch? Being in God's presence is the only thing which makes our soul healthy. And you are the keeper of your soul. It isn't anyone else's job. Our competence and success can't do it. You choose how you want to live. When you are in God's presence, you can give your impatience, frustration, anger and fear to God. God will listen. God will be with you. And God will care for you, holding you close.

During this season of Advent, we'll wait on the Lord's coming together. And we'll rediscover hope. For Jesus' love calms all fears, heals all hurts and restores even the most broken people to wholeness. I don't know about you, but this fills me with joy. Alleluia!

Our church has a walkway from the parking lot to the church patio. Many members of our church are elderly, in their 70's, 80's and 90's. Hence, many of our beloved have passed away. Along this walkway, on either side we have planted a rose bush for each precious person who now resides with our Lord. There are now about 20 rose bushes on each side of the walkway.

When Bob passed, we got the darkest red rose to comply with his quirky request. It was a very small and struggling rose bush. Bob was not small; he was six foot four inches tall!

When all the rose bushes in his row began to bloom, his had not one dark red bloom!

However, Bob's dark red bush was prolific with six beautiful blooms! That was the story of my Bob. Interesting and adored by his family fulfilling his roll carrying on his out of the box ways. Contrary even now with his memorial rose!!
